GUEST SPEAKER

Barbara Clark

I began working in clay in college- William and Mary- where I graduated in 1976. I went on to graduate school at the University of Virginia and then got a job in Las Vegas with the Clark County School District. Working in clay is the medium I generally work with, but I also have done fused glass, and metal work. Currently, I work mostly in porcelain on the wheel and high fire in a gas kiln. I have bought an electric kiln and I am experimenting with the new lines of glazes that are fired to a somewhat lower temperature. I have been juried into one book, and have done some commission pieces. I also do some quilting and would someday like to do some fiber art.

IN CASE YOU MISSED IT!

Our 5/14 meeting featured David Clark who has works with wood. His presentation focused on his latest interest, turning Victorian Era ornaments on his wood lathe. He demonstrated the step-by-step process of constructing the blank for a Celtic knot ornament and the lathing steps. Additionally, he also demonstrated two other period ornaments, Christmas trees and bells. Each ornament comes in its own Baltic Birch wood case. He sells most of the ornaments for \$45.00 each.

He specializes turning ornaments containing Celtic knots and exotic woods such as Purple Heart, Blood Wood, Yellow Heart, Cedar, Maple and Walnut and Austrian Pods, China Berry and Lacewood from Brazil. Since the hard woods blunt his tools, he needs to constantly re-sharpen the tools. He uses a special type of glue called "Ticon".

June 1 – 30th, 2014**

Here are the guidelines to enter the Lost City Museum:

1. Place a letter of authenticity on the back of your art work.
2. Place a short bio of yourself on back & price.
3. Arrive to hang your painting on June 1st between the hours of 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, no exceptions.
You will be required to remove your art on June 30th between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm.
If you need help with hanging or removal, please contact board member Dennis Watts at 702-204-8504, or Jamie Schab 702-379-3628 for arrangements. They will be going to the Museum to place the art and take it down.

4. Fill out the inventory sheet (provided on the e-mail (previously sent) for all the artwork you hang and give it to Janie (Lost City Museum associate) at the Library before you leave.
5. All artwork must be on wire to hang. No wire can be seen when hung.

6. Directions to Lost City Museum:

15 north to Highway 169 turn right off highway 15. Continue on 15 to the Museum. It will be on your right. If you get lost the phone number to the museum is 702-397-2193. Total distance to the Lost City Museum from Las Vegas is approximately 63 miles.

Clark County Library Show, July 29 – August 21, 2014

Bring the **accepted** artwork on **July 28** to the Flamingo Library at 1401 E. Flamingo

This time is **12-1:30** pm in the front lobby (at the seemingly back of the library).

The **D rings are 2" down** from the top. (framed or gallery wrapped as well) all sizes the same with the rings.

Metal frames need a hanger that fits in the back rails/slots along the sides; the frames usually are a put together type and have the hardware with them.(separate pieces) You can put them together, they are easy; you need the **plex precut** IE Art stores(look for coupons) or Home Depot or Lowes.*

Work on paper must all have a mat and a backing. Cardboard really isn't what you want to use as it leaches out. Artist tape is the best to put on the mat to hold the painting to the mat. All work larger than 16x20 needs plexiglass. Remember, this is for paper entries. Oil and acrylics down really need covering. **Nothing smaller** than 16x20 (11x14 pix size)

Put a short bio on the back for your buyers; Also, upper right hand corner, you can put the certificate of authenticity. As of this moment we have 19 artists. I believe the lobby space has room enough for 25 maybe 30, depending on the sizes.

You can rewrite your certificates if you choose of course. This is just a guideline and should add to our credibility as a guild.

The Artist reception is August 10th 2:00-3:30 pm.

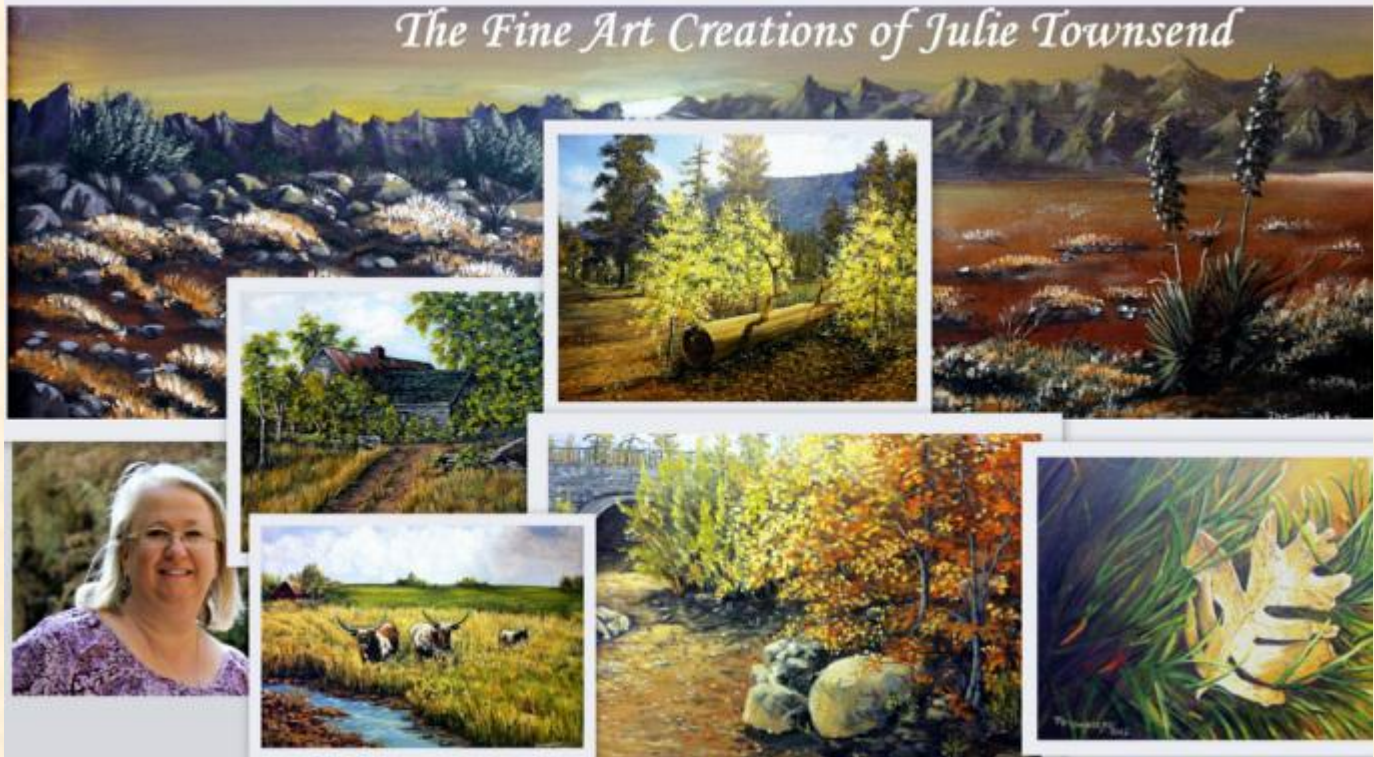

Tribal Treasures: Regional Baskets and Their Collectors

A collection of more than 100 baskets hand made by Southern Paiute Indians and other regional Native American tribes will be on display at the Clark County Museum from Saturday, Feb. 8, through June 30. There will be a preview opening from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 7, featuring gallery talks by Museum Curator of Exhibits Dawna Jolliff.

The collection, entitled "Tribal Treasures: Regional Basketry and their Collectors," will be featured in the Heritage Gallery of the museum's indoor exhibit gallery.

The baskets were created in Southern Nevada by Las Vegas Paiute, Moapa Paiute, Chemehuevi, and Panamint Shoshone Indians between 1880 and 1930. Some baskets have been on display in the museum over the years individually or in groupings, but Tribal Treasures marks the first time the museum's entire collection has been shown as part of one exhibit.
