IN CASE YOU MISSED IT!

Gregory Colhouer presented a very informational presentation on the use of water based oil paint which is a safer alternative to the traditional oil paint. Water mixable oil paint is a workable and safer medium than traditional oil paint. Water mixable oil paint is oil paint that has been chemically altered to allow water to temporarily mix with it. The water essentially replaces all paint thinners. As long as the paint is wet, water can be used to thin paint and clean brushes. Trial and error will teach the artist using this paint when the paint is no longer mixable do to drying process. For all practical purposes water mixable dries into a real oil painting. If the artists does not like the new paint, it can be mixed with traditional oil paint in a 1-3 ratio.

Safety is another good reason to switch to water mixable oil paint. Many artists are allergic to any kind of paint thinner! It is toxic whether one can smell it or not. Secondly, paint thinner mixes with oil paint which is also very toxic. Paint thinner speeds up the paint drying process. The evaporating gas formed by thinner and paint creates an invisible cloud of poison in the air of the studio. This poison will eventually settle onto any drink or food nearby. It will also poison food in refrigerators where some artists store their paint loaded pallets to save time and money. It is not safe to do that either. There are at least three brands of water mixable oil paint - Duro, Max, and Artisan. Although these three paints are slightly different in makeup, I have successfully mixed them. I prefer Artisan. It is a little stiffer out of the tube. Artisan has many mediums to add in order to make it more flexible than the other two. I always mix stand or linseed oil with a special thinner with the oil paint. Ratio is 33 1/3 linseed, thinner, and oil paint. Artisan is produced by Windsor Newton. There are many Atrisan mediums like linseed oil etc. They are made to use with the water mixable oil paint Water mixable oil paint may be used on the same surfaces as traditional oil paint. 

I am also an active supporter of various environmental organizations, animal rights groups and children's charities.


As an artist in Las Vegas, I have been expanding my artistic creativity and growth within the art community. I enjoy participating in art events, shows and exhibitions.


