Michael Davies was born in San Francisco in 1956. The second born and only son of four children, art became his passion at a very early age. His Father was a Big Band singer who, after his military service in the Korean War, came back home to find a very different world musically, and subsequently found it impossible to support a family in that line of work. He found himself having to make a living in the sheet metal trade. Michael’s Mother, a piano teacher, was very interested in art. After noticing that “drawing was the only thing that seemed to keep his attention for any length of time” she gave twelve year old Michael a large book featuring the works of Salvador Dali, introducing him to the art world and setting him on an artistic journey that would prove to be lifelong.

Never satisfied to stay with one medium or subject matter for very long, he has explored many. His media has included: Sculpture, (both constructionist and carving) Acrylic Painting, Colored Pencil “painting”, Lino Block Printing, Airbrush, and most recently, Mural art both indoors and large scale outdoor works. Michael’s subject matter has included Surfing, Landscapes, and Abstracts, but overwhelmingly Michael has found Portraiture, both Human and animal, to be his favorite subject matter in all his different media.

Not having the patience for school, Michael is largely self taught. Taking the time and effort to learn new media by creating many works with that media, has been his artistic education.

After a two year experiment with his own “parlor style “art gallery, the Slo-Motion Gallery is done but Mike is back out in the freelance art world. Always looking for new projects and new media to develop, he is a busy and prolific artist.



IN CASE YOU MISSED IT !

Sensei Muriel Scrivner gave a demonstration on the art of Ikenobo/Ikebana, a Japanese Floral art over 550 years old. Muriel has achieved over 18 training certificates which is equal to a doctorate level. The word “Ikenobo” is comes from the name of the original school in Japan, where Ikebana originated.

While living in Japan for 8 years, she began her studies. She returned to Japan an additional 16 times for further study on the art of Ikebana.

All Ikebana is based on nature, past, present and future. There are many Japanese terms associated with Ikebana including Shin which holds the most power, the power of 7, Soe, the 2nd highest power, the power of 5, and Tai which is the power of 3.

She gave some wonderful demonstrations of Ikebana, along with ideas on how to make flowers last longer, such as using a “cigarette tea” for Calla Lilies”, or using Gin or Vodka for Tulips.

Sensei Muriel travels around the United States teaching the art of Ikebana.

She has written a book titled “Ikenobo Floral Arts Vacation Institute” on how to preserve flowers and woody materials. You may purchase the book from Sensei Muriel for \$20.00.

Muriel teaches classes the 2nd Saturday of the month, and the following Monday for a cost of \$30.00 for 1 class, \$50.00 for 2 classes including supplies.
